The new Library cart is now available for member's use with several new books and DVDs. This is one of the many wonderful perks to members of GCWS.


All members expressed their appreciation to Library Chair, Judy Gregg, and Donna and Jim Grisham for their help. - \diamond -

Watercolor In Review

SHERRY GRAINGER

This will be a monthly GCWS Newsletter feature in which Sherry Grainger will review watercolor paint, paper, and other items. Sherry is a 6 year member of GCWS and currently does Name Tags for the Society. Sherry has been painting in watercolor since 1969 when she studied with the late Irving Shapiro at the American Academy of Art in Chicago, IL. Sherry loves trying new colors and methods, so she will be reviewing those things for everyone's information.

This month in honor of St. Patrick's Day, we will review a green paint, well, actually, it's a Black pigment with a greenish cast. Intrigued? Well, here we go.

Perylene Green



This paint is Pigment PBk31. It is permanent with regards to lightfastness. It is semitransparent with medium staining. It does not granulate. Developed in the 1950s, it is a modern synthetic organic pigment that comes to us from the auto industry.

In a landscape, it is a good choice for dark water, foliage, or rocks stained with algae or sea life. It can easily be substituted for Indigo blue, Neutral Tint, or Payne's Grey as a dark. As a single pigment paint, it is a good mixer with other colors that are not spoiled by the strength of the Perylene Green pigment. It should be noted that the most successful mixes are other single pigment paints like Cobalt Blue or Aureolin (Cobalt Yellow) or even Transparent Brown. In portrait painting, it would be helpful in shadow areas of olive toned or darker skin or reflected shadows on lighter skin from green or blue garments.

Pigment Codes

Sherry Grainger Format PXxn

P (stands for Pigment), Xx stands for Color Family, n stands for the assigned pigment number, so PXxn as coded for Cobalt Blue is PB28, Cobalt Green is PG50, and Cobalt Violet is PV14. The number is assigned when the pigment is registered using the next available number. When a paint contains multiple pigments they are each listed and separated by a comma, so Winsor & Newton's Burnt Umber is made up of PBr7, PR101, PY42.

W = White	R = Red	V = Violet
Bk = Black	B = Blue	G = Green
Y = Yellow	O = Orange	Br=Brown
