## MARCH 14TH MEETING — DEMO & POINTERS FROM PREVIOUS STAN KURTH (SK) & JEAN FRANCOIS ARNAUD (JFA) WORKSHOPS!



Mary Lee Weaver's demo painting 3/14/24

Mary Lee Weaver — shared a very quick demo from the *Stan Kurth* (SK) workshop beginning with the following supplies: Pilot Precise V5RT pen, ART GRAF VIARCO TAILOR SHAPE water soluble black, white & graphite, and watercolor. Stan mixed Titanium White Gouache with his lighter colors to make the eyes rest in the middle of the paper. However, Mary Lee mixed the gouache with Indigo to outline

a person. Not as Stan suggested, but it turned out in her favor! What she thought at first was a mistake, suddenly became her perfect picture.



Jeanette Hooks — shared a monochromatic painting from Kurth's workshop. Jeanette had never experienced the freedom of this style of painting. The white gouache gave it the values, textures and shapes that were new to a stiff necked portrait artist. She says, "Never would I have tried this method without Stan Kurth's lead."



**Cris Bolley**— JFA's work is impressionistic or loose realism. He used large round brushes to paint broad strokes with a limited palette. A **White porcelain plate** to mix paints is best for pigments. Cris also discovered **100% cold-pressed cotton paper is important** to allow the paint to flow freely.



JFA said to **"Draw fast and paint fast."** He sketched landscapes quickly without detail, using vanishing lines to place the shapes. He often completes a painting in 20-30 minutes. He said, **"First paint the light, then the shadows with a couple of strokes**, then the images of life (like people, animals, and manmade items.)" The idea of his technique is to **capture the feeling of the scene**, **not the details**. If we want details, he said take a photo instead of painting.

Jim Buchan — JFA uses a very limited palette of colors one of which is Sennelier Indigo (for shad-ows). You can really see the difference that adding indigo has made in this (unfinished) seascape.





**Jo Ann Kruger** — There is a method to intuitive painting. Stan encouraged us to use "the library of elements." His instructions drew heavily from line, color, value, shape, texture and direction to name a few.

Step 1: Line drawing

Step 2: Line and color, adding resist or salt for texture. Begin composing using the library of elements and "save the whites."Step 3: Mix the pigments used in step 2 and apply as a thin glaze.Step 4: Mix pigments with white gouache and paint negatively.

## **April Meeting – Painting Greeting Cards**

Kay Hays will demonstrate how to use plastic wrap along with stencils and other "found

objections" to create interesting textures for greeting cards. She also uses these techniques in some of her paintings.

You are welcome to bring supplies and join in as she demonstrates the process. Recommended supplies if you want to try her technique during the meeting are:

- Small pieces of watercolor paper (no larger than <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> sheet)
- Plastic wrap or any type of lightweight plastic
- Spray bottle and water jar
- Paints
- Large brush and 2 smaller brushes
- A book larger than the paper to press the plastic and paper until it dries (which will also help with transporting it home)


