To pique your interest, here is a peek at **C #1:** <u>COLOR</u>—Before beginning a painting, work out your color choices emphasizing:

- ♦ Both variety and cohesion
- Any potential pitfalls with staining or fugitive pigments
- ♦ Judicious use of complementary colors.

What are the other "C's of Watercolor"??? Calligraphy, Canvas, Casein Casting, Chiaroscuro, Classical Style, Collage, Contrast, Charging-in, Chroma, Cockling, Cold Press, Color Wheel, Complementary, Composition, Content, Contour, Convenience Color, Cool Colors, Craftsmanship, Critique, Cropping, Cubism.....You will have to come to the program to find out!



New! Paint Along Saturdays



On **Saturday April 27** six members of GCWS gathered for a paint along event. Together we watched videos by watercolor artist **Bob Davis' series Watercolor Secrets on adding figures to landscapes**. After watching each video we tried our hand at what was demonstrated as well as discussed some of the instructions and advice that was given. All the participants were pleased with the outcome of the day and left with greater confidence in working with figures.

Some of the important lessons we learned:

- For figures in landscapes you are painting the "suggestion" not the detail.
- The hair on the human head plays a major part in providing the necessary detail of where the figure is looking and which way they are moving.
- Shadows are critical in grounding figures into the landscape.

The exhibit features artists from 31 states with 80 total works on display. This is a national, annual juried exhibition recognizing contemporary American water media painting. Approximately \$20,000 in cash awards and museum purchase awards are made annually.
