But don't feel constrained by this suggestion. (Basic paper goods and a beverage will be provided.)



We had a great time learning about favorite supplies



and more importantly, enjoying the various works of watercolor art that people brought to show. We even had new members participate in the

show and tell. Links provided for as many of the items as possible but items are likely available at multiple retailers.

Win showed off a Herend Brush (RL-5220, #12) with her name imprinted on it.

Robert brought three of his favorite sketchbooks. Master's Touch Mixed Media Sketchbook by Hobby Lobby, Delta and Gamma Series Premium Mixed Media Sketchbook both by Stillman & Birn.

Lynsey showed off a TikTok find, a <u>Meeden Folding</u> Brush Washer.

Becky had her Airtight 18-Well Palette on display.

Judy has been enjoying working with <u>Daniel Smith PrimaTek</u> paints that are pigmented using minerals as she loves the "sparkle" and granulation that they provide.

Jim G finds that an **Erasing Shield** helps when he needs to scrub out a mistake.

Donna showed us handy tools for framing including: Scotch ATG700 Tape Gun, Fletcher Framer Point Gun and points, Oil Cutter for cutting glass.

Clair loves to make loose lines and grasses using Scrog-gy's Loose Goose brush (#5) from Cheep Joes.

Diane reaches for her **cell phone** to take pictures of things that catch her eye as she is out and about. This provides her with reference photos that she is the copyright holder for as well as being a constant source of inspiration.

Program — A Few of My Favorite Things

Jim B brought his favorite **roll of TP wrapped up in clean paper towels** that will quickly absorb extra water from a brush. He also keeps on hand **soda bottle caps** that he uses as a small reservoir for masking fluid. Jim likes to use a **metal screen** to make a fine mist of masking fluid or **Permanent White Gouache** (Winsor & Newton).

Carolyn showed us ways that she uses <u>Daniel Smith</u> <u>Watercolor Ground</u> (transparent) to prepare various surfaces for watercolor painting.

Amy showed off a handy phone/tablet holder, the <u>HoverBar Duo</u> by twelvesouth, to make viewing reference photos easy.

Jim O. has found <u>Inktense</u> pencils by Derwent to be a helpful way to add darks to his works.

Jo sang the praises of Da Vinci Paint's <u>Mauve</u> which can be mixed with almost any other paint (both cool pigments and warm pigments) to make an impressive range of colors without mixing mud. It is a fantastic way to add shadow to almost anything.

Sheri loves <u>YouTube videos</u> and has made a lot of greeting cards by making a print of her work on <u>linen</u> <u>paper</u> and adhering it to Strathmore <u>cards</u>.

Jerry uses a **drafting straight edge** to make straight lines of paint without getting the paint on the side of a ruler. He offered to let anyone borrow it.

Brenda showed us her go to brush the <u>Silver Brush</u> Black Velvet (3000S #8).


