

Skies, Skies with Posey Gaines

Posey Gaines won Best of Show in 2023 because of his incredible skies! He works fast and loose, a style of painting that we all can benefit from. Registration and payment is due by June 21st.

All that is needed in the way of supplies is:

Paper: Arches Cold Press or Rough watercolor paper— I will be using a 14" x 20" Arches R pad for

my paintings

Watercolors: your normal palette will work fine

Brushes: Large brush - quill, mop...and any of your normal brushes

Spray bottle: small

Meet GCWS past president—Tim Buchan

We are all very fortunate to have an organization that promotes watercol-



or as a medium. As some of you may already know, I joined GCWS in 2006. Between 2010 and 2020 I was able to serve as president for seven years taking time off for cancer treatment in between. I've enjoyed taking part in leadership for GCWS member shows, library and volunteer teaching watercolor classes and demonstrations.



Inheriting painting skills from my Scottish-born grandfather (a self-taught oil painter), I began painting at age ten. I received Saturday morning paint-

ing classes at Philbrook Art Center and soon began private oil lessons from their instructors. During high school I was introduced to watercolor learning only the basics; washes, transparency, etc. Upon graduating from the University of Arkansas in '71 and marrying my beautiful wife Karen, I began my 46-year career with Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company. Shortly thereafter, I walked into a frame & art supply shop on Brookside planning to purchase oil paints but found myself admiring watercolor paintings on display by "signature" artist - Hugh Walkinshaw. The owner mentioned that Hugh was offering watercolor lessons and I was totally taken away with his work which in turn began a 50+year watercolor career.

Since Hugh retired in 2004, I've enjoyed attending multiple workshops from nationally known watercolor artists like Charles Reid and Nita Engle and so on. Today I enjoy teaching, painting and watching artists invest their time and talents in watercolor.

"Lighten Up, Loosen Up"

Richard has a true passion for watercolor and enjoys the opportunity to share his knowledge and experience with students of all levels.

Taking a Richard Stephens workshop will be full of informative technical information, entertaining and educational painting demonstrations, and lots of one-one time as he helps you through your individual painting process.

A day starts with a short presentation on the "topic of the day" determined by the level and interest of the class. It is not so much a lecture as it is a conversation. Richard encourages feedback and questions as he feels we learn from each other, and that everyone has something important to share.

Richard will demo at least one complete painting demonstration a day. He constantly explains what he is doing, and more importantly, why. Most demonstrations last about an hour and the students learn techniques, creative use of the

"tools" of watercolor such as brush choice and manipulation, color mixing and the water/pigment relationship. There is always strong emphasis on the elements and principles of design.

After the demonstration the students will start on their own paintings or the class will work together on exercises designed to reinforce the theme, "Lighten Up, Loosen Up". Richard offers individual advice as per subject selection, designing the image on the page and technique based on the unique style and goal of each student.

In summary, a Richard Stephens workshop is informative, challenging, and fun! It is not about competition or turning out a great painting during the workshop, it's about being exposed to a process of
