From the President

Someone recently asked me a great question: "Why is the entry fee for the Member Show double that from last year and why doesn't our annual membership fee cover the cost?" The Member Show is our biggest event of the year - with a \$500 cash prize for Best in Show, a fee for the judge, and other expenses for putting on the event. The GCWS Board set the entry fees in such a way to minimize the overall impact of the costs of the event on the treasury of the society. The entry fees will not cover all the expenses of the Member Show but will go a long way. By charging an entry fee for the Member Show, GCWS has funds from the annual dues that allows us to cover other costs throughout the year such as modest honorariums to non-members who present a program at our general meetings (like Becky Mannschreck and Nancy Harkins).

Thank you Nancy!

Nancy reminded us that **VALUE** is number 1! Squinting will help you get the values. Detail can be around the center of interest and less detail everywhere else. Planning with the small value sketches that we have heard so much about will help you find the value in your painting. The value sketch does NOT include details. Finally, decide on colors. Nancy uses the back of the painting or any sheet of scrap that you might have to decide on the colors you will use.

She was great showing us the process of painting from top to the bottom. To prevent hard edges forming, wash brush then dry the brush with rag or paper towel. This will smooth out the paint. (See the clouds from the pic below). To dry out your brush, use a paper towel in hand to get it dry.

Supplies for May General Meeting Paint-Along

Paints – suggested colors: Hansa Yellow Light, New Gamboge, Quinacridone Rose, French Ultramarine Blue, Transparent Red Oxide (or Burnt Sienna), Carbazole Violet.

Brushes – suggested brushes: large brush (like a quill or mop such as Escoda Aquario Gold Mop 16), Medium Round (such as DaVinci Maestro round 4), Small Round for grass detail (such as DaVinci Cosmotop round 2), 1" Flat Wash brush (such as Cosmo top Spin Mottler).

1/4 sheet of paper taped to a board with sketch of buffalo

Water container, paper towels, etc.



Watercolor Classes:





Combining photos: We'll be painting this beautiful sky then adding the animal with grasses; you can paint only the sky, if you prefer, or make the buffalo a silhouette, but the technique for this isn't hard!



Prep sketch: draw or trace the bison, add a horizon line. I suggest lowering it more than in my painting. More room for sky, less grasses!

Paper: Arches Cold Press watercolor paper (1/4 sheet size)

Daniel Smith Watercolors:

Hansa Yellow Light
New Gamboge
Quinacridone Rose
French Ultramarine Blue
Transparent Red Oxide
Carbazole Violet

Brushes:

Large brush - quill, mop. The sky needs lots of paint and water! (Escoda Aquario Gold Mop 16)
Medium round (DaVinci Maestro round 4)
Small round for grass detail (DaVinci Cosmotop round 2)

1" Flat Wash brush (Cosmotop Spin Mottler) Reference photos: point your phone's camera at a QR code and it will link you to the original photo at Unsplash (free).

Meet the GCWS past president—Robert Freeman



Born and raised in Missouri, Robert joined the USAF and served for 6 years in Spain, Korea and the US.

After his service he began his career in chemical research at Conoco Inc. in Ponca City, Ok. Then in 1983, he resigned his position at Conoco and sold his house, to pursue a professional degree in Architecture at OSU. After graduation, he joined a firm in Tulsa and remained in the city until he retired in 2023.

He has enjoyed art and particularly drawing all of his life but was able to hone his skills even further throughout his career in architecture and design. Prior to 2016 most of his graphic work was in pen and ink with design markers for presentations to clients. However, in 2016 his sister, a very ac-

complished artist and educator in her own right, introduced him to the world of watercolor. It has been his passion ever since.

Initially he worked primarily in sketch books and "Plein Air". However, after being introduced to GCWS, his world opened up. He met so many talented artists working in so many different ways and in larger formats, not just in a sketchbook. He enjoys the creative process and learning new techniques and ways to explore the world of art! Currently, he is also working in Gouache and mixed media.

Robert teaches Drawing & Sketching classes at Ziegler's Art & Supply and mentors a Watercolor Studio there as well.

In addition to Green Country Watercolor Society, he is also a member of Alpha Rho Tau Artist Association and the Tulsa Artist Guild.

"Lighten Up, Loosen Up"

Richard has a true passion for watercolor and enjoys the opportunity to share his knowledge and experience with students of all levels.

Taking a Richard Stephens workshop will be full of informative technical information, entertaining and educational painting demonstrations, and lots of one-on-one time as he helps you through your individual painting process.

A day starts with a short presentation on the "topic of the day" determined by the level and interest of the class. It is not so much a lecture as it is a conversation. Richard encourages feedback and questions as he feels we learn from each other, and that everyone has something important to share.

Richard will demo at least one complete painting demonstration a day. He constantly explains what he is doing, and more importantly, why. Most demonstrations last about an hour and the students learn techniques, creative use of the

"tools" of watercolor such as brush choice and manipulation, color mixing and the water/pigment relationship. There is always strong emphasis on the elements and principles of design.

After the demonstration the students will start on their own paintings or the class will work together on exercises designed to reinforce the theme, "Lighten Up, Loosen Up". Richard offers individual advice as per subject selection, designing the image on the page and technique based on the unique style and goal of each student.

In summary, a Richard Stephens workshop is informative, challenging, and fun! It is not about competition or turning out a great painting during the workshop, it's about being exposed to a process of



Thay 2025 Recommendations From Our Library

If you enjoy an escape to the great outdoors either in your mind, in a photo or in fresh air, you will appreciate Jack Reid's "Watercolor for the Fun of It Easy Landscapes" This book offers ways to paint in watercolor no matter where you find yourself in this increasingly stressful world.

Mr. Reid simplifies the equipment, breaks the chapters down into simple subjects that make up all landscapes such as water, trees, mountains, skies, buildings and textures. Follow along with step-by-step demonstrations and enjoy great results.

You'll learn how to prepare a portable painting kit, how to buy and prepare paper, and five basic watercolor painting techniques. Some exercises are simple and require one-two colors only; others are a bit more complicated, requiring a full a palette. Whatever your interest, Mr. Reid invites you to enjoy the experience.

I found his techniques and steps easy to follow and practiced several small paintings. These I plan to gift as cards.

Another book you might find helpful is Jacqueline Penny's "Painting Greeting Cards in Watercolor". She says, "Painting greeting cards is a great outlet for your creativity plus you gain a one-of-a-kind gift for a special occasion."
